It is one of the two aided colleges under University of Kerala to offer specialization in Space Physics at PG level. The department also provides well-equipped laboratories for physics, electronics, computer science and space physics and state-of-the-art library facilities both at UG and PG level.

COLLEGE LIBRARY



College Library is the nerve centre of all the academic activities of the college. It provides a place where teachers and students can pursue research and study unhampered by noise or any other disturbance. Its facilities and services exist

solely to cater to the needs of the academic community of the college. The college library, which is a repertoire of rich knowledge resources with a collection of over 4500 books, 1250 e-books and several subscription of top periodicals and journals. The Library thus acts as the key source of academic assistance to the student and teaching community. The college library is located in the main building on the first floor with a total area of 2000 sq.ft with a total seating capacity of 50. Library starts functioning at 9 a.m. and closes at 5.00 p.m. on all working days, providing resources and materials that support the educational, professional, and personal information needs of our students, faculty and staff.

There are special sections for reading, lending and reference. Internet browsing is also available. The library is fully computerized and digitized with Machine Readable Catalogue facility for searching and Bar-coding for detection and transparency. Students and teachers visit the Library regularly and make use of the digital and print resources provided. The library is automated with the software KOHA version 21.11 for the overall management of library operations. Our Library is available 24×7 and D space is used for digital library which is also available always online. Books are classified according to Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme 22nd edition. We provide open access facility in the library actualizing the





prime objective of providing the right information for the right user at the right time. The collection includes print documents as well as electronic documents

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL (CGPC)

The cell provides students with information relating to various avenues of higher education. Students are also regularly notified of various employment opportunities. Campus recruitments are also arranged.

WOMEN'S CELL

Women's Empowerment and Gender Equality are the most important requirements for the upliftment and progress of our nation. ANTI-RAGGING AND STUDENT GRIEVANCES REDRESSAL CELL

Anti-ragging Cell should be one of the important parts of an Educational Institution's mechanism. As per the guidelines of UGC under the Act of 1956, which is modified as UGC regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, the establishment of an Anti-Ragging Cell is very compulsory. The cell functions to look into the grievances lodged by any student. Students may approach the cell to voice their grievances regarding academic matters, health services, library and other services. Any form of discontent or dissatisfaction on the part of the students can be informed to the cell. The Grievance cell also looks into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the Coordinator or member of the Students' Grievance cell. Grievances may also be sent through email to the Co-ordinator of the Students' Grievance Cell. The cell then redresses the grievances promptly and judiciously. As a result of this mechanism, the institute has pleasant ambient atmosphere and good work culture with in-built goodwill and mutual understanding among the students.







MINORITY GRIEVANCES REDRESSAL CELL

The minority cell of the college was established to empower the minority communities in the college. The minority cell aims to provide services to the educational and cultural needs of the minority community along with other caste, creed and Nationality. The cell basically helps minority students for their academic development and encourages enrolling for career orientation programmes. The Cell is committed to provide assistance to the minority students along with Scheduled /Scheduled Tribe students through counselling, personality development, communication skill, remedial coaching, and preparatory classes for professional and employment purposes, etc.

INTERNAL EXAMS CELL

INFRASTRUCTURE

The college functions in a future-ready building with a total area approximating to one lakh square feet.

Laboratory: General Physics Lab and Computer Science Lab for UG Physics Students and General Physics Lab, Electronics Lab, Computer Science Lab for PG Physics students are provided.

Computer labs: Separate computer labs are available for PG and UG students

COLLEGE LEVEL COMPETITION

- College level competitions will be held not later than the second week of November every year, under the supervision of a committee comprising the Principal, Staff Advisor, College Union Chairman and General Secretary, College Union and Secretary, Arts Club.
- Principal shall appoint judges for various competitions who shall be persons of proven proficiency in the concerned field.
- No competition needs normally be held in any item, if the number of competitors in the item is less than 2. However, if the College level Committee is satisfied that the standard of performances is quite high, the student may be presented for the University Youth Festival.
- College will select one student for each item to represent the College in the University Youth Festival. However, it is left to the discretion, of the College level Committee, to send one more student or a particular item in case we are satisfied with the competence of the second candidate.

UNIVERSITY LEVEL YOUTH FESTIVAL

- The University level Youth Festival will be held before the Christmas holidays every year.
- The venue of the Youth Festival will be fixed by the Kerala University Union
- The First, Second and Third prizes for different items shall be awarded on the basis of the following formula. The average marks awarded by the 3 judges shall be the norm for the award of first, second and third prizes, Generally the variation of the mark awarded by different judges shall not be greater than 20 % If (of the three marks awarded by the three judges) the difference between the highest and the lowest marks awarded exceeds 20% the highest or the lowest as the case may be shall not be considered, instead the average of the two marks, the difference between which does not exceed 20 % shall be taken. 3 But in case the difference between the marks awarded by three different







judges is greater than 20% the two marks with the minimum difference (though more than 20%) shall be taken as the basis, and the average of the two marks taken.

- There will be an individual champion among boys, girls and transgenders decided on the basis of the total points scored by the individuals. In case of a tie, the actual percentage of the marks scored by the competitors shall be taken as the basis.
- The team championship shall be decided on the basis of the total points scored by the college.
- In addition to the participants, college can send two staff members and Secretary, Arts Club along with the contingent.
- The actual travelling and food expenses for the contingent shall be met out of the college union fund.
- Stage and stage equipment shall be provided by the festival committee. But make-up, accompaniments etc, are to be arranged by the participating team themselves.
- Detailed list of the events can be availed from the Arts Club Coordinator/ Arts Club Secretary











GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS TO CONDUCT VARIOUS PROGRAMMES

- All Celebrations in the campus, including Union activities, should be held only after getting prior permission from the Head of the Institution.
- Celebrations of any type should be communicated to the Head of the Institution through the Staff Advisor concerned at least five working days prior to the event, with programme details, guests attending, source of funds expenditure estimates etc.
- The 'Discipline Committee' should monitor and supervise the celebrations in the college.
- Students' Union activities should be supervised by a committee chaired by the Head of the Institution with Staff Advisor as Convener and HoDs and Discipline Committee as members.
- All students have to wear identity tag in the campus.
- Student's vehicles will be allowed only up to the designated parking area. Entry beyond that point is strictly prohibited.
- Public, including former students, will be allowed to enter the college campus only for genuine reasons.
- Programmes by External agencies / Professional groups / Paid programmes such as Musical events shall be permitted inside or outside the campus only on strict observance of the following conditions:
- i. Complete information regarding the programme should be communicated to the Head of the Institution at least five working days prior to the event and prior permission sought from the Head of the Institution.
- ii. Members of teaching faculty must be present at the venue to oversee the smooth conduct of the program


